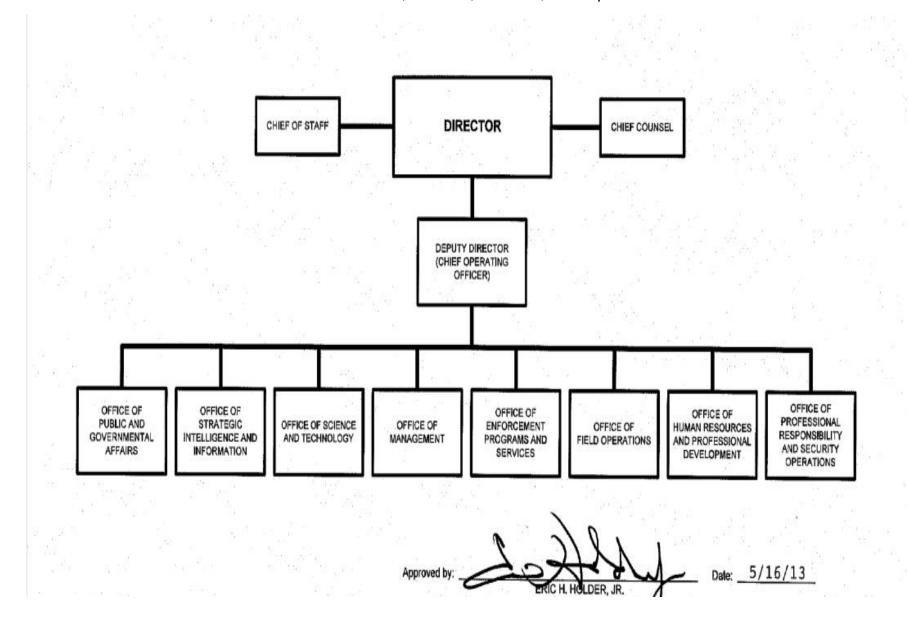
# **Organizational Chart**

# Status of Congressionally Requested Studies, Reports, and Evaluations

Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives

- 1. The Senate Report associated with the FY 2021 appropriations act directs DOJ to conduct an assessment of the NCETR building and ATF ranges, including a review of space availability and usage as well as efforts undertaken to forge facilities sharing agreements between ATF and other Department components, and submit a report to the Committee within 180 days of the enactment of this act on its findings and future plans to ensure NCETR and the ATF ranges are fully utilized by the Department. Due no later than July 16, 2021.
- 2. The House Report associated with the FY 2021 appropriations act directs ATF to submit an annual report on U.S. and Mexico firearms trafficking and trace data. Submitted to DOJ on May 18, 2021.
- 3. The House Report associated with the FY 2021 appropriations act directs DOJ to update the Committee on its NIBIN presence on the Southwest border no later than 90 days after enactment. Submitted to DOJ on February 17, 2021.
